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Life in the Spirit

Galatians 5:16–18 (ESV)

But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.
For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do.
But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

Writer's Explanation:

Paul highlights the ongoing tension between our sinful nature and the Spirit's work in our lives. Walking by the Spirit requires intentional daily choices to align our thoughts, desires, and actions with God. The Spirit empowers believers to resist temptation, cultivate self-control, and experience freedom from guilt. True Christian living is not about striving in our own strength but about being led by the Spirit, resulting in a transformed life that honors God in thought, word, and deed.

Expanded Takeaway:

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The Fruit of the Spirit

Galatians 5:22–23 (ESV)

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.

Writer's Explanation:

The fruit of the Spirit represents the character of Christ cultivated within believers by the Spirit's power. These qualities are evidence of God's work rather than human effort, demonstrating a life surrendered to Him. Each attribute serves both God and others, shaping relationships, attitudes, and responses.

John 15:4–5 (ESV)

Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me.

I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.

Writer's Explanation:

Jesus makes clear that fruit is the natural result of abiding. Our role is not striving harder but remaining in Him. Apart from Christ, there is no spiritual growth.

Expanded Takeaway:

The fruit of the Spirit is the evidence that we truly belong to Christ. These qualities are not human achievements but divine results of staying rooted in Christ. The Spirit grows them in us gradually, like fruit ripening on a tree, as we yield daily to His work. Our focus should be abiding in Christ, not striving in our own power.

Discussion Questions & Answers:

- Q: Why is the fruit of the Spirit called 'fruit'?
A: Because it naturally grows from a Spirit-filled life rather than forced effort.
- Q: Which fruit of the Spirit do you most need to grow in?
A: Personal application varies — reflection is needed.



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Led by the Spirit

Romans 8:14 (ESV)

For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.

- Q: How does being Spirit-led affect daily decisions?
A: It brings wisdom, peace, and alignment with God's purposes rather than human impulses.



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Power of the Spirit

Acts 1:8 (ESV)

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.

Writer's Explanation:

The Spirit equips believers for boldness, endurance, and effective witness. This power enables ordinary believers to live extraordinary lives for God's purposes. It manifests in courage to proclaim the gospel, resilience to withstand trials, and wisdom to minister effectively.

2 Timothy 1:7 (ESV)

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Keeping in Step with the Spirit

Ephesians 5:18 (ESV)

And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit.

Writer's Explanation:

Colossians 3:16 (ESV)
